



Customs Reclassification Approved by MOF

On January 06, 2017, the Minister of Finance Elbuchel Sadang approved and signed the newly reclassified position for the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection (BCBP). Also signing the reclassified position descriptions were the Director, BPSS and Acting Director of Customs.

If you recall, the BCBP was re-organized and created under Executive Order No. 381 back in 2015. The new activities were re-aligned to ensure government efficiency and effective delivery of services to the general public. The reclassification process included a series of meetings with the Bureau of Public Service System (BPSS) and Customs. The new Customs structure went through a lengthy review process and was finally approved along with the positions that were evaluated based on current job functions and salaries by the BPSS.

Employees impacted by this reclassification will include about 40 Customs Officers and staff. The reclassified positions to be announced will include management positions such as the Director, Chief of Border and Management & Enforcement, Chief of Revenue & Trade Facilitation, Chief of Corporate Services, Customs Senior Positions and other front line positions to include the Customs Officer III, II and I as well as the Drug Detector Dog positions and Administrative positions. Employees general job duties will remain the same, though they may have new titles that will be best aligned with their existing duties.
