NOTICE OF SEIZURE & INTENT TO FORFEIT

Effective: December 18, 2019 – January 18, 2020

The Bureau of Customs and Border Protection (BCBP) Notice is hereby given as required by Section 4.6.1.3 Notice to claim goods of our Customs Rules & Regulations that any claimant to property seized by customs must be claimed within 30 days from the date of this notice. Customs will also contact and notify claimants to come in and provide evidence or proof of ownership of such items.

These items include the following: Electronic equipment (Cell phones, laptops, computers, printers, keyboards, chargers, converters / adapters, etc.)

Otherwise, any goods not claimed shall be considered as forfeited or abandoned goods and will be sold at auction or disposed and the owner shall not be allowed to claim the merchandise once the merchandise has been processed and advertised for auction.

Any person who claims to have an ownership or possessory interest in this property and desires to claim this property must file a claim with the BCBP. If a personal notice letter is not received, the claim must be filed within 30 days from the date of final publication of this notice. A filed claim shall identify the specific property being claimed, state the claimant's interest in such property and be made under oath, subject to penalty of perjury. Unless such a claim is received by the above office by close of business on January 18, 2020, the property will be declared forfeit to the ROP and disposed of in accordance with the law.
